The APA in-text citation for a book includes the author's last name, the year, and (if relevant) a page number. In the reference list, start with the author's last name and initials, followed by the year. The book title is written in sentence case (only capitalize the first word and any proper nouns).

Parenthetical In-Text Citation. The APA citation format should include edition, initials, and author, and publication date. Also, a semicolon should separate the edition and initials. However, one should use a comma to separate the author and publication date. In turn, details must appear inside the rounded parenthesis when citing a DSM-5 in APA 7.

An APA in-text citation includes only three items: the last name (s) of the author (s), the year the source was published, and sometimes the page or location of the information. References include more information such as the name of the author (s), the year the source was published, the full title of the source, and the URL or page range.

An APA image citation includes the creator's name, the year, the image title and format (e.g. painting, photograph, map), and the location where you accessed or viewed the image. When you include an image or photo in your text, as well as citing the source, you also need to list it as a figure.

Name the author and the publication date in-text before a quote. To simplify the in-text citation, place the last name of the author in the text to introduce the quote and then the publication date for the text in parentheses. You can then leave the author's name and the publication date out of the quote itself.
