On-going treatment of pannus over the life of the animal is usually required as a cure does not exist. When started early in the course of disease, medical therapy is usually successful at controlling the condition. Much of the redness and some of the pigment may be resolved. When severe scarring is present, surgery is occasionally required. Medical treatment:

TREATMENT AND FOLLOW-UP Treatment Options Topical steroid and cyclosporine medications are the most com-mon therapies used for pannus. In mild to moderate cases, topical steroids may be used alone. In severe cases, topical steroids may be combined with a steroid injection into the adjacent conjunctiva or with topical cyclosporine.

There is no cure for pannus, but there are several ways to treat the condition. The most common treatment is through medications that keep the blood vessel growth and cloudiness under control.

Pannus rheumatoid arthritis treatment Nonsurgical management. Nonoperative treatment of rheumatoid involvement of the cervical spine (rheumatoid spondylitis, ankylosing spondylitis) is supportive. Early aggressive medical management is important in the global sense, as cervical involvement has been correlated with disease activity.

Treatment options for pannus in dogs are vast and varied. In most cases, treatment involves the use of topical corticosteroids or some other kind of immune-modulating drug. In dogs that have developed secondary infections, antibiotic eye drops or ointments may also be recommended.

Cyclosporine has been used by veterinary ophthalmologists in the treatment of Pannus for 12 years now. A 1%, 1.5% or 2% solution is most often used, and was prepared in an oil base-usually olive, corn or vegetable oil.

Treatment involves using topical corticosteroids (typically prednisolone or dexamethasone) or other immune modulating drugs such as cyclosporine. On occasion, an injection of steroids under the conjunctiva may be done. Antibiotics are sometimes required in cases that have developed a secondary infection.

Medical treatment usually consists of topical medications. Topical steroids and immune-mediating drugs are used together to control the disease. Topical corticosteroids such as prednisolone acetate are applied frequently in the beginning. Topical cyclosporine is also applied frequently in order to gain control of the inflammation.

Diagnosis and Treatment for Pannus. Clinical signs are the basis for most pannus diagnoses. Your veterinarian may also perform certain eye tests, including an intraocular pressure test, corneal staining, and biopsy of the cornea or conjunctiva. Unfortunately, there is no cure for pannus, and scarring and discoloration typically cannot be reversed.

Most hospitals treat the pannus as a ' gross only ' specimen — meaning that we do not look at it under the microscope. We weigh, examine and describe the firm yellow fat attached to the large, elliptical-shaped portion of skin. In the middle of the skin surface is usually the umbilicus (belly button).

How We Continue to Underestimate the Pannus

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The area of enhancing pannus was determined in each slice by manual segmentation of the pannus using the irregular region of interest (ROI) facility in the program ImageJ. . Tissue in the expected anatomical site and exhibiting strong contrast enhancement was considered to be enhancing pannus.
