God ruled over Israel in the Promised Land from the time of Joshua (1405 B.C.) to Samuel and his sons (1050). Saul then becomes the first anointed human king when the people reject the Lord's rule over them (1Samuel 8 - 9). His reign ends when, after wounded in battle, he takes his own life on Mount Gilboa (1Samuel 31:1 - 6, 2Samuel 1:1 - 5).
